





Overview of coproduction and the TED in East Lindsey Offer Work-stream 4

Signposting to legacy and self-sustainability

A core feature of TED in East Lindsey groups is a move to self-sustainability past current allocated National Lottery resources. This work-stream draws on the experience of designing and establishing Friendship Groups with a dedicated Friendship Officer. It depicts a flow-chart of the development of groups which can have application to other groups established by TED in East Lindsey commissioned partners. Work-stream 2 provided details of the role of a shared Quality Mark as a mechanism for coproduction and work-stream 3 has given a detailed thematic checklist of considerations for establishing coproduction in groups – drawing on the learning reports TED in East Lindsey has produced to date. There are similar processes which delivery partners have engaged with (the flow diagram is given at the end of this document). TED in East Lindsey has also produced a number of Learning Reports with thematic findings which can be used as signposts for considering how coproduction can lead to self-sustainability – the final part of the TED in East Lindsey coproduction journey relating to relationships, establishing groups and creating a legacy that can continuing (attracting additional funding streams and creating capacity for ongoing engagement and coproduction).
